Daniel Paul Schreber (German: [dani?l p?ul ?reber]; 25 July 1842 – 14 April 1911) was a German judge who suffered from what was then diagnosed as dementia praecox (later known as paranoid schizophrenia or schizophrenia, paranoid type). He described his second mental illness (1893–1902), making also a brief reference to the first disorder (1884–1885) in his book *Memoirs of My Nervous Illness* ...Lacanian Sites.
